

Case Study: Himanshu Case (Gokulpuri, Delhi)

A) Case Background and Family Structure

Himanshu, 18 years old, lived with his parents and siblings in Sanjay Colony, Gokulpuri. He studied up to 9th standard and worked in a nearby factory. The family belongs to a low-income background. Himanshu was in friendly communication with a girl named Ayesha, who lived two lanes away.

B) Incident Summary

On 07.04.2025, Ayesha's brother Shahrukh took Himanshu aside near a public toilet and, along with his brother Sahil and another person, attacked him with a sharp weapon. Injured, Himanshu returned home, informed his parents about the attackers, and was taken to the hospital, where he later died. Two accused—Shahrukh and Sahil—were arrested, and FIR No. 0128 was registered on 07.05.2025.

C) Analysis of the Case (Key Points)

- The attack appears linked to the family's opposition to Himanshu's interaction with Ayesha.
- The incident reflects elements of **violence driven by control over relationship choices**.
- Previous false allegations and demands for money by Ayesha's mother indicate pre-existing tension.
- The killing aligns with patterns seen in **honour-based violence**, where male family members retaliate to protect perceived family honour.

D) Conclusion

Himanshu's case highlights a serious incident of targeted violence rooted in relationship-related conflict. With two accused arrested and the case under investigation, continued legal monitoring and support to the family remain essential.
